The Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO) is pleased to report that OPIC has met the first milestone for the Open Government Directive. The first milestone required that all Federal agencies submit three high value DataSets that can be used to increase agency accountability and responsiveness; improve public knowledge of the agency and its operations; further the core mission of the agency; create economic opportunity; or respond to need and demand as identified through public consultation. The initial DataSets will provide the public with raw data on greenhouse gas emissions (“GHG”) attributable to OPIC projects as well as project employment impact data. This is the same raw data that is used to create the OPIC Annual Policy Report.

This was a cross agency effort with representation from OCIO, Legal Affairs, Office of External Affairs, the Office of Investment Policy and Records Management. The implementation team for the first milestone consisted of SE Solutions’s contractor, Tai Allen, Adam Drzal, OPIC’s Enterprise Architect and Chris Astriab, OPIC’s Web Manager.
